What is a Relaxed Performance?

A relaxed performance is intended to be responsive to and inclusive of audience members who may benefit from a considered, relaxed environment at the theatre, including (but not limited to) those with autistic spectrum conditions, anyone with sensory or communication disorders, learning disabilities, anxiety, or anyone who wants more freedom as an audience member.

A relaxed performance works to break down the expectations put onto an audience member, regarding their role as an audience member. Loud noises, bright lights, unclear rules and protocols, and not being confident in going to the theatre can all be detractors to those who would like to come along.

A 'relaxed' performance works to meet that audience halfway, giving reasonable permission for people to be comfortable as themselves, and relaxing the rules of theatre to allow for this.


What does this mean for you?

- Practically, the performance on the night will have its tech augmented to make the theatre space more relaxed for those who have sensory requirements and comfort behaviors, including stimming, pacing, rocking, humming, and other noise making.
- The theatre capacity will be capped at 75% of its usual capacity, and there will be a designated pacing area, so there will be space to move and be comfortable.
- The lighting and sounds will be altered to become softer, while still offering the same dramatic experiences to an audience.
- The audience lights will remain on at a low level through the show, so there is never any moment of complete darkness.
- The door to the front of house area will remain open throughout the performance, so that people may come and go at any time.
- Should an audience member want or need to leave the performance and take a moment – to relax or to attend to their own needs or someone else's needs – there will be a designated area, the "relaxed room", provided. Chapel Off Chapel and A_tistic staff will be on hand to take you there and monitor the room.

Getting There

The performance will take place in the Chapel theatre at Chapel Off Chapel, 12 Little Chapel Street, Prahran, Melbourne, Vic, 3181.

The venue is located near the corner of Chapel Street and Malvern Road.



Public Transport Train


From Flinders Street Station, Chapel Off Chapel can be reached by taking the Sandringham line train to Prahran Station and then walking to the venue (an 11 minute walk).

Tram

Chapel Off Chapel can be reached by taking trams routes 72, 78 or 79, stopping at the corner of Chapel Street and Malvern Road/Commercial Road, and walking from there (a 3 minute walk).

Parking

A car park with limited parking is located on the premises, accessible via Little Chapel Street. The car park contains three Disabled Parking spaces. Street parking is available in surrounding areas. Parking restrictions are enforced, so please check street signs carefully. There are also several car parks nearby; Chapel Off Chapel has provided a list of nearby car parks and their operating hours at <u>https://chapeloffchapel.com.au/your-visit/</u>.



Venue Access Information

Wheelchair and mobility device access:

The main entrance of the venue is wheelchair, walker and pram accessible. The door does not open automatically; a staff member will open the door for attendees who may require assistance.

The theatre has facility for wheelchair access and seating that allows more room for the use of mobility aids. To ensure that seating will be arranged for your specific access requirements, call the Box Office to book on (03) 8290 7000.

The chillout room is wheelchair accessible via elevator, and its location will be clearly signposted.

D/deaf and Hard of Hearing access:

A hearing system is available at Chapel Off Chapel – in The Chapel and The Loft theatre. The system provides coverage to patrons wearing headphones or neckloops available from the Box Office. There is no extra charge for this service, simply ask Box Office staff for assistance when you arrive.

The Relaxed Performance will not be Auslan interpreted.







When you reach the silver box, keep walking until you reach the red pointy sculptures near the front entrance, then walk between the sculptures and the silver box ...



... and you'll see the front entrance and the car park. Go through the front doors ...




... and you'll enter the foyer, and see the box office/bar. If you selected the "pick up tickets" option when you booked, goo to the box office ...






Come to the Chapel entrance, where a staff member will be waiting to take your ticket and show you inside.




You'll go through this coridoor...




... and into the theatre ...

The Chillout room will be located in the Mezzanine. To get there from the foyer, follow the Mezzanine sign ...




The stairs look like this.




... and you'll find an entryway with stairs up to the mezzanine on one side, and an elevator up on the other.

Seating Note

For the relaxed performance, the theatre will be booked at a reduced capacity so that there's less chance of the audience feeling crowded.

Seating will not be specifically allocated for the relaxed performance; when you book online, you'll see that all seating is general admission seating. However, specific seats can still be allocated if you have an access requirement involving specific seating arrangements – please let the box office know on (03) 8290 7000.

Show Notes

Bright Star is a musical, and will be performed with a live band. The volume of microphones for the singers and band will be somewhat lowered during the relaxed performance, but will still be at a volume loud enough to create a live musical atmosphere.

Some of the band members will also perform as actors in the musical. Some performers will play multiple characters.

There will be no strobe lights used during this performance. During the final scene before intermission, there will be **some use of cycling, non-strobing lights** to simulate movement. There will also be use of a **smoke machine** in the scene before intermission. This will be the only time these effects are used during the performance.

In this performance, sound will be created using not just conventional instruments but also props and set, including milk crates which will be used to make percussive sounds. The sound will be dampened for the relaxed performance.


At the end of the intermission, the band will begin playing in the foyer, and will encourage the general audience to re-enter the theatre for the second half of the show. It's ok to ignore the band's encouragement, and they won't pressure you to re-enter if you're not ready – remember you can come and go from the performance whenever you wish.

Performers will enter and exit using the aisles and walkways in the seating bank. There will be no direct audience interaction, except for the band's encouragement to the whole audience to re-enter after intermission.

Bright Star contains some difficult themes and performance of heightened emotional moments. A detailed list of content warnings is provided below.
