Songs for a New World is truly a special and intriguing show - a collection of standalone songs, each a self-contained story or moment in time. This structure allows for a diverse range of characters and scenarios, making it a versatile and thought-provoking production. While the show was written in the 1990s, its themes of navigating uncertain times, making pivotal choices, and finding strength in adversity remain timeless. This adaptability of the piece allows a fresh and relevant interpretation of the socio-cultural landscape of our time.

Jason Robert Brown's compositions are emotionally charged and beautifully crafted, offering a rich tapestry of musical styles that span from poignant ballads to powerful anthems. The intricacy and depth of the compositions provide performers with a profound opportunity for artistic expression, demanding both vocal prowess and emotional authenticity.

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR



Hello Traveller! It is my great honour to once again welcome you aboard our vessel at the iconic Chapel Off Chapel, on the traditional lands of the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung and Bunurong peoples. I invite you to join us in our prayer to community and embark on an exploration of hope, love, loss and adventure in this award-winning reimagined production of Jason Robert Brown's Songs for a New World.

It is not lost on me how rare it is to be able to revisit a project so beloved. Returning to this show two years on, has been a profound privilege and a creative reawakening. To delve back into its evocative music and timeless stories, surrounded by returning cast members and fresh new faces, has been nothing short of magic.

This wild and wonderful show offers snapshots of pivotal, life-altering moments that transcend time and space. It is a tour of hearts and minds - from a woman (quite literally) on the edge, to the future star of basketball, to the sister wives of Santa Claus, to reunited lovers. The choreography, crafted by creative visionary and my long term creative collaborator, Benjamin Curé of Lion Heart Dance Company, once again astonishes me with its precision, detail and instinct. This beautiful music - complex, soaring and emotionally rich - is in the best possible hands with our extraordinary musical director, Mark Bradley.

Visually, our production remains rooted in the organic, nautical and spiritual, with echoes of oceans, galaxies, and earthy rituals. Harry Gill (set design) and Sidney Younger (lighting design) return with their signature ingenuity and care, while our neutral-toned costumes remain essential to fluid character transitions across eras, moods, and moments.

It is hard to put into words how deeply I admire this cast. These 17 supernovas are not only exceptional artists, but truly generous, grounded humans. The trust, talent and connection they bring to the room is unique and precious. A special thanks to Katie McMillan and Jackson Britza, our extraordinary swings, whose hearts and hustle keep the wheels turning.

There is no set blueprint for this show - and that is what makes it so thrilling. The team approached casting with curiosity, bravery and care, prioritising diversity, fluidity, joy and surprise at every turn. The part allocations have been selected based on instinct and essence rather than gender presentation and every choice has been made in service of authenticity and connection.

To our producer Benjamin Samuel - thank you for trusting me once again and for championing artist-led work. Soundworks is a beacon in our industry, and I am proud to be a part of its orbit.

And now, dear audience member - I invite you to open your heart and mind as we take you into our New World once more. May you be reminded that life is beautiful, everything is fleeting, and glimmers of happiness - no matter how small - are worth holding onto with both hands. We need this show now more than ever.



A NOTE FROM THE CHOREOGRAPHER

Working on this production has been one of the most rewarding and fulfilling experiences I've had to date and it's such a joy to be revisiting this work alongside this powerhouse team. The sense of collaboration, passion and investment from every member of the cast, creative and production team has been a delight.

Lauren and I worked closely together to sow intention and purpose into every movement - with a vision to use dance to support the story-telling without overshadowing it. I've used stylistic threads throughout the show to ensure the movements feel like part of a single production - while also crafting a unique identity for each instance where dance is featured.

One of the things that most excited me about this particular project was the creative freedom and unique challenge of creating choreography for a show that doesn't normally contain dancing. Normally you'd have some of



reference for how you'd like to reimagine certain scenes or you would play with movements while still retaining the essence of the original choreographer's dance vocabulary. But in this case, there was freedom to explore innovative ways to bring each of these moments to life - making them all feel unique and equally important. Returning to the show over a year later, it has been such a joy to refine and enhance certain moments, while also allowing the magic of the first iteration to stay unchanged in many parts.

I hope this show brings you as an audience as much heartfelt joy and invigoration as it has me; this show came at the right moment in my personal and creative life and has transformed the trajectory of both in ways I never anticipated. In the spirit of the show, one moment truly can change your life.

Lauren's directing credits include: The Addams Family (Stars and the Moon), The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee (Patrick School of the Arts), FAME (Soundworks Academy), Judy - Australia - 1964 (Skunkworks Productions), Jack Frost (Jamm'd Productions), DreamSong (EbbFlow Theatre), FLUID (Courtney Act/Working Management, Associate Director) and Puffs; or Seven Increasingly Eventful Years at a Certain School of Magic and Magic (TEG Live, Resident Director). In 2024, Lauren was appointed Artistic Director of Stars and the Moon, Melbourne's only all-abilities music theatre company and pioneers of the castmate model.
