WRITER'S NOTE

"Is THE PLAY HAWKE pro-Hawke or anti-Hawke?" asked Duncan Kauffman. He had acted as Malvolio in Twelfth Night at school. I pointed out that the question makes no sense. Acting in Shakespearean plays, his aunt had "become" Ophelia, Lady Macbeth and G B Shaw's Saint Joan". Ernie Gray, the Dramaturge of HAWKE, had "become" Oedipus Rex and Othello.

These characters are now mythic beings, beyond reality, attaining a type of immortality.

So it is with *HAWKE*. Those who knew him intimately share divergent stories.

He is the only Australian prime minister to hold a world record, in his case for drinking beer as a student at Oxford.

An intellectual larrikin?

His public popularity, personal flaws and elements of the tragedy visited upon his own family, continue to confound.

Shakespeare used the term 'politician' to describe 'a crooked plotter or schemer'. Prime Minister Hawke debated and persuaded. He was a politician loved by 75 per cent of Australians for nine years. A success we had never seen before, and will never see again.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In Emily Wilson's translation of *The Odyssey* she refers to the hero as "a complicated man". An apt description for the protagonist of our play. Bob Hawke was indeed complicated – and contradictory. Almost a mythological figure: an Australian Agamemnon.

This is the story of a great man who was flawed. For some, he is a ghost of the past. Many audience members will know a bit about his life, but not all the details. His ambition, corruption and sexism will resonate with people of all ages.

The issues in the play are universal: family secrets, hypocrisy, drugs, sex. All the characters wrestle with angels and demons, to different degrees. They all struggle to find salvation and redemption and peace of mind in the imagined "Limbo" setting.

When Paul Kauffman approached me to work on this story, I was strongly attracted to its themes and its exploration of power and politics. Its characters (all real people) are fascinating – not least Hawke himself, who still casts a shadow over our political landscape. (In recent weeks yet another biography of him has been published.)

The structure – songs and music juxtaposed with dialogue scenes – was a particular challenge. David Pereira's music is evocative and emotive, and necessitated finding performers who were not only strong actors but who had the vocal range to do justice to the songs.

I was most fortunate to obtain a highly talented and deeply committed cast who have given their all to this production. Thanks to Mike Bishop, Peter Houghton, Ana Mitsikas and Chelsea Plumley. It could not have happened without them.

My gratitude, also, to my long-time friend and colleague, Ernie Gray, whose input and support were invaluable.

SYNOPSIS

Australia's Prime Minister Hawke won four consecutive elections and gave the highest popularity rating of any Prime Minister since the introduction of public opinion polls. His enormous success was however founded on a heinous act.

After his death, Hawke meets his two wives, and a bishop with a dark past. Their eternal fate will be sealed in either Heaven or in Hell.




Chelsea Pumley SECOND WIFE

Mike Bishop is an actor, director and all-rounder who has worked extensively in all facets of the entertainment industry across Australia for over 40 years.

Mike Bishop's theatre highlights include Harry Potter and the Cursed Child (Cover: Amos Diggory; Albus Dumbledore; Severus Snape), Singin' in the Rain (RF Simpson), Sweeney Todd, The Sentimental Bloke (Ginger Mick), Victoria Bitter, Cyrano De Bergerac, and Blabbermouth, all for Melbourne Theatre Company. He also appeared in Twelfth Night as Malvolio, Romeo & Juliet (Lord Capulet), Summer Of The Seventeenth Doll (Roo), The Campaign & The Reunion by Neil Cole, Sideshow Alley (Tiny McKenzie) by Gary Young, Kismet (Jawan), in Guys & Dolls (Big Jule) for The Production Company, and as Max Kellerman in Dirty Dancing which enjoyed a yearlong and very successful full Australian tour.

Mike Bishop's television credits include Neighbours (for which he was drama coach for 15 years), Bastard Boys, Law of the Land, Stingers, BlueHeelers, City Homicide, and the Emmy Award winning Blabbermouth & Stickybeak, in which he played Kenny Batts. Mike has also appeared in Howzat! Kerry Packer's War, Killing Time, Underbelly 1, Underbelly: Fat Tony & Co, Wentworth and The Dr Blake Mysteries for ABC.

Mike Bishop's film credits include *Malcolm, Remembering Nigel,* and *Metal Skin & Ghosts of The Civil Dead* for which he was nominated for an **Australian Film Institute Best Actor Award**. Mike was also recently featured as "B" in the film *I am Evangeline*.

Mike Bishop's direction highlights include Shakespeare's **The Wind in the Willows, A Midsummer Nights Dream** (8times), Jema Pledger's **Greenroom Award** nominated **See You In Heaven, Dr Cade, Personality Games & Topo** by Neil Cole; **Only The End, The Devil In Me**, and **The Show Must GoOn** - the biographical story of Jan Russ by Robyn Bishop.

CREATIVES



DENNY LAWRENCE

DIRECTOR

DENNY LAWRENCE has worked in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States as an actor, writer, producer and director in film, theatre, radio and television. He has degrees from both the National Institute of Dramatic Art and the Australian Film and Television School and he also studied with Stella Adler.

Many of his productions have won awards, including at the Australian Film Institute (now AACTA) and the British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA). His production, the Australian television series **MDA**, gained an International Emmy Award nomination and won an AFI Award for Best Series and Best Actor and Actress.

Denny has directed several feature films (*Emoh Ruo, Afraid to Dance, Rainbow's End etc*) numerous telemovies (*Archer, Army Wives, The Centurion et al*) and miniseries (*Bodyline, Palace of Dreams et al*) and hundreds of hours of television (including The Bill, Blue Heelers, A Country Practice, The Man from Snowy River, MDA, State Coroner).

Denny has returned often to work in the theatre, where his productions include **A Soldier Dreams** (Theatre East, NY) **Loyal Women, Belleville, Love Love and Lovesong** (all Red Stitch Theatre, Melbourne); **The Crucible** (National Theatre, Melbourne): **The Caucasian Chalk Circle** (Federation University): **Love-All** (The Concourse, Chatswood) and national touring productions of **Always Patsy Cline, Educating Rita, Love Letters, Shirley Valentine, Glorious, All My Love, My Brilliant Divorce, Hotel Sorrento, Wallflowering and Summer of the 17th Doll.**

In recent years Denny Lawrence co-wrote and directed two new musicals: *Utopia* and *Baby Boomer* and a satirical cabaret, *Perfect World*. He also co-wrote and directed a new musical, *Honeyland*, in New York in 2024.

He was Executive Director of Television and Acting and Directing Studies at New York University's Kanbar Institute of Film and Television. He has taught at the Strasberg Institute and at Stonestreet Studios in New York.



P. KAUFFMAN PLAYWRIGHT/PRODUCER

HAWKE was written over two years by P. Kauffman with Denny Lawrence and David Pereira, as they searched to discover highly qualified Australian actors who could also sing superbly.

P. Kauffman as **Playwright** and **Producer** has had an enduring love of the stage, acting whilst at school and university. He was lead actor in school plays and was Dionysos in Euripides' The Bacchae at University, and studied four Greek plays in Greek. He studied Asian languages, Aboriginal Studies and history and anthropology, and gained a doctorate after living with the Bhil tribe of Central India and writing their history and sociology.

Kauffman has worked with Labour and Liberal Federal Ministers, and developed many social programs with First Nations people over many years after his family were adopted by the Yunkaporta clan of Cape York in north Queensland, learning about their customs, language, dances and sacred sites.

He wrote and produced the play **The Woman Behind William Shakespeare**, Directed by Dr Cate Clelland and two books and twenty articles on Shakespeare. AWARDS

In Australia awards are preferably mentioned only in a sporting context. Kauffman was once Ballarat's under 17 800 metre Champion. He won Greek and Latin prizes at the University of Melbourne for reciting Virgil and Homer's journeys to the Underworld. His acting in Max Frisch's play *The Fire Raisers* won the Sun-Herald award for best school play in Victoria. Later Kauffman won an Australian National University Medal and two Canadian and a French, German and Swiss Award for excellence in research. His greatest prize was meeting Jan Louise when acting as Dionysos. That is worth far more than ten Academy Awards or Logies.



DAVID PEREIRA COMPOSER

David Pereira is one of Australia's most eminent cellists. He is also a composer.

He was a Senior Lecturer and Distinguished Artist in Residence in Cello at the Australian National University's School of Music for many years.

He graduated as "Student of the Year" at the **Sydney Conservatorium of Music** and studied with Fritz Magg at **Indiana University** and completed a master's degree in Cello Performance in 1979.

He played with the **Australia Ensemble** for 11 years, and was Principal Cellist of the **Australian Chamber**Orchestra for seven years and of the **Sydney Symphony Orchestra** for three years.

Pereira has performed all the cello concertos and major concertante pieces from the standard repertoire (Dvořák, Elgar, Schumann, Saint-Saëns, Johann Christian and Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach, Beethoven's Triple Concerto, Brahms's Double Concerto, Bruch's Kol Nidrei) as well as premiering concertos written for him by Australian composers such as Richard Mills, Barry Conyngham, David Lumsdaine, Larry Sitsky, Mary Finsterer and Bruce Cale.

He has appeared in Europe, Russia and the United States with the **Australian Chamber Orchestra** and the **Australia Ensemble**.

He has performed at the **Lincoln Center** and the United Nations (with Stuart Challender and Dame Joan Sutherland), in China, India, the Philippines and Japan.

He has recorded the complete works for cello by Peter Sculthorpe and Einojuhani Rautavaara and the complete solo cello suites of Johann Sebastian Bach.

AWARDS

Awards include twice winning the Sounds Australian Award for the Best Performance of an Australian Composition (Carl Vine's Inner World; David Lumsdaine's Garden of Earthly Delights).

He has written three books on cello technique: Eloquent Cello Technique (2003), A Cellist's Companion (2005) and The Larrikin Cellist (2008).

He has played in solo and chamber capacities in the Arts in the Valley and the Canberra International Music Festival. David Pereira's compositions include pieces for cello and piano "Mt. Ainslie Rising" and with Tamara Anna Cislowska at the Canberra International Music Festival.

He practices Yoga Asana and Meditation.


David is married to cellist Gillian Pereira and has seven children, the youngest is 14 years.

ERNIE GRAY DRAMATURGE

Ernie Gray is the Dramaturge of *HAWKE*. He won the *Sun-Herald* best school actor in Victoria as Oedipus Rex at 16, gained entry to the National Institute of Dramatic Art. At 17 Gray played *Othello*, was awarded best school actor again and embarked on an illustrious acting and writing, career in film and television. Early in his career he worked with the Royal Shakespeare Company.

He is an best known as an actor in **Chopper, Mercury,** and **Something in the Air** and **Shooting Blanks** and **Snowy River: The McGregor Saga.**

In television he has starred in The Librarians, Scooter: Secret Agent, BackBerner, MDA, Stingers, Round the Twist, Frontline, Something in the Air, Clary Hawker, Thunderstone, Pig's Breakfast, The Genie from down Under, Good guys, Bad Guys, State Coroner, My Second Car, Mercury, Justice, Blue Heelers, Janus, Jim Seaton, Paper Back Romance, The Feds, A Woman's Tale, Jigsaw, Parliamentary Type, The Henderson Kids II, The Flying Doctors, Archer's Adventure, The Sullivans, Ryan, Matlock Police, Homicide, and Division 4.

On stage he acted as Othello at age 17, and as lago at age 37. He wrote 12 plays for schools, and established theatre companies. *'Fix it Alice'* (re. Ford's first female motor mechanic) is published by Heinemann.

Between 2000 and 2024 Ernie Gray also taught drama at Trinity College at the University of Melbourne.



DR EDWARD NEEMAN

PERFORMING PIANIST

The Australian-American concert pianist Edward Neeman has appeared as a soloist with the **Prague Philharmonic, Sydney Symphony, Melbourne Symphony, Kentucky Symphony, Symphony of Northwest Arkansas**, and the **American West Symphony** among others.

Dr. Neeman's discography includes his critically acclaimed debut album, *Rachmaninoff & Sitsky*, as well as two contemporary music releases from 2022: *Language of Angels* (premiere recordings of Larry Sitsky's piano works) and as a collaborative artist on *David Pereira Cello Works* (Tall Poppies). An upcoming album, *Poems for Piano: A Century of Ballades* will be released later this year. Dr. Neeman has made numerous piano duet arrangements for the Neeman Piano Duo, in which he performs with his wife, the Indonesian pianist Stephanie Neeman.

Dr. Neeman holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The Juilliard School. He is on the piano faculty at the Australian National University in Canberra. www.neemanpianoduo.com



ZACHARY CONNOR PERFORMING CELLIST

Zachary Connor is one of Australia's most promising young cellists. He grew up in Canberra and has studied cello for eleven years, performing frequently in Sydney and Canberra.

Zachary Connor has performed many immense works of the classical canon, including

Shostakovich's Cello Concerto No.1, Dvořák's Cello Concerto, Chopin's cello sonata, Bach's Six

Suites for solo cello, and Cassado's suite for solo cello. Zachary performed a number of these works alongside Edward Neeman in Zachary's own critically reviewed recital series in Canberra at the Australian Centre for Christianity and Culture.

Zachary was also a key member of youth music groups in Canberra, playing as the Principal Cellist of both the **Canberra Youth Orchestra** and the **Canberra Youth Symphony Orchestra**, the latter of which he performed in front of as a soloist on multiple occasions, even premiering his own compositions.

Zachary graduated from youth music early however, and in 2024 became the youngest member of the professional **Canberra Symphony Orchestra**, and has played with them since.

At the national level Zachary competed in the **Musica Viva Strike a Chord** competition, earning a finalist place, and at an international level, performed as a part of **Bach in the Dark Cello Sextet**. Outside of the classical sphere he has performed at numerous musical theatre productions and has understudied David Pereira for the past two years on Hawke.

Zachary, much like his teacher, has also taken to composing, composing multiple original works, all of which have been performed, some which have been critically appraised. The works include *Martyr*, the soundtrack to a short film of the same name, and *A suite from the Afterlife*, originally a piece for a stage production. Both works received performances by Zachary, Edward Neeman and David Pereira as arrangements for two cellos and piano.

Zachary is not only a bright rising star cellist, but composer and artist too.



DANIELE BUATTI REHEARSAL PIANIST

Daniele Buatti is a Melbourne-based Music Director, Pianist, and Vocal Coach with more than a decade of experience across professional theatre, international touring, and education. He has served as Music Director and Vocal Coach for Life Like Touring productions including *Gabby's***Dollhouse** and **PAW **Patrol**, and worked with Cirque du Soleil (*Luzia*) coaching performers in stamina, vocal health, and stylistic expression.

Daniele has accompanied and coached for major audition seasons of *Wicked, Back to the Future, Book of Mormon, The Lion King,* and *Anastasia*. He is the long-standing Music & Creative Director of **Broadway Unplugged**, directing concerts that spotlight Australia's leading and emerging musical theatre talent.

A dedicated educator, Daniele works with Carey Baptist Grammar School, Federation University, and Be You Group, guiding young artists in technique and performance. His work is recognised for combining artistic leadership with evidence-based, somatic approaches to training versatile, industry-ready performers.



GINA GASCOIGNE LIGHTING DESIGNER

Gina Gascoigne is a lighting designer with over 30 years of experience. She has worked for contemporary dance groups internationally and more locally theatrical productions, circus companies and directors including Kamarra Bell-Wykes, Outer Urban Projects, Archie Roach, Circus Oz, Snuff Puppets, Susie Dee, Melbourne Festival, Adelaide Festival, La Fura dels Baus, Chamber Made Opera, Maude Davey and The Flying Fruit Fly Circus, The National Institute of Circus Arts (NICA), a world-renowned centre based in Australia.

She has a Masters in Research (Fine Art) at RMIT and is a Certified Feldenkrais practitioner. This is a system of movement education developed by Moshé Feldenkrais that uses gentle, guided movements to improve body awareness, coordination, flexibility, and efficiency.

As an artist Gina Gascoigne's sculpture-based practice draws on her background in lighting and somatic education to investigate the sensory and psychological effects natural and manmade landscapes have on how we place ourselves in the world. She utilises everyday materials to create works that develop a sense of narrative within the surfaces, examining notions of memory, time and place.

ADRIENNE CHISHOLM COSTUME DESIGNER

Originally trained as a Graphic Designer, Adrienne went onto to study Theatre Design at The Victorian College of the Arts.

Adrienne has designed sets, costumes and puppets for both Melbourne and Sydney Theatre
Companies, The Victorian Arts Centre, Circus Oz, Red Stitch Theatre, Hit Productions, Andrew Kay
Productions, The Keene Taylor Theatre Project, 45 downstairs, Federation University Arts Adcademy,
The Wiggles and received a Green Room Award for her set design for The Burlesque Hour now
seen all around the world. Adrienne was Parade and float designer for Melbourne's much Loved

MOOMBA Parade in 2010.



ELLA THOMPSON STAGE MANAGER

Ella Thompson is a stage manager who is new to the Naarm theatre scene.
