Following a five-year stint in the US studying and working at Chicago's prestigious The Second City and iO Improv Theatre, Ben returned to Australia where he has appeared in Thank God You're Here (Ten), We Interrupt This Broadcast (Seven) and, on the Abc, Aunty Donna's Coffee Cafe, Home Alone Together and The Weekly.

Ben's 2014 debut show for the Melbourne International Comedy Festival, *The Tokyo Hotel*, was nominated for Best Independent Show. It subsequently toured nationally, played at the Edinburgh Fringe and was adapted into a radio play for ABC Podcasts.

Ben won the MICF's Director's Choice Award in 2024 for his show *Ben Russell*. He is the co-creator of cult comedy web series *Hug The Sun* and a frequent collaborator on the YouTube channel *Grouse House*.
